When two gangs from the British underworld start a turf war, James Adams, who works for Cherub, must infiltrate the most dangerous gang of all to help the police.

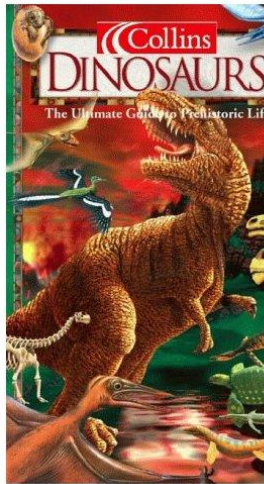

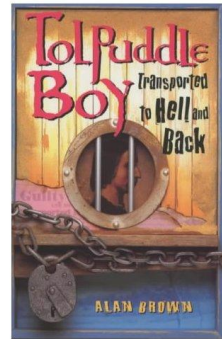


Now a reality show celebrity, nineteen-year-old Jane Roberts learns that not all of her new friends are trustworthy.

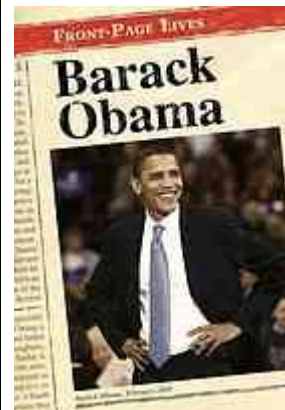
