
Assessment is Changing!

participate as part of their personal development and attainment of lifeskills.


Centenary Ireland

Stratford students embark on ICT skills from 1st Year



Students at Stratford College start the Irish Computer Society (ICS) Skills Card modules from 1st Year. Over a number of years they will complete 7 modules from the ICT curriculum and 4 modules from the Computing Curriculum.

The 7 ICT modules are online courses, while the 4 modules from the Computing Curriculum - programming, microcontrollers, digital media and multimedia storytelling - are taught as hands-on practicals in class using 21st Century teaching and learning methodologies, promoted by Trinity College's **Bridge 21** programme.

Students will be awarded with a European Computer Driving Licence on successful completion of these modules.
