


Dear Friend of Stratford,



As you know the Department of Education and Skills asked all schools to consult with staff, parents and students on the use of Mobile Devices in school. On-line questionnaires were distributed to students and parents by the PA, Zeeko and the school, the results of which were made available at the meeting on Wednesday, 12th March. Staff were widely consulted. The results identified amount of time spent on-line, most popular apps, the use of parental controls etc. Most of our students don't have a screentime app on their phones. I will circulate these to you when finalised but you might be interested to know that a small number of our students are engaged in risky behaviour on-line.

Many thanks to the PA and Locksley Messam in particular for a very comprehensive examination of the issues involved and to Ms O'Kelly who has researched many aspects of the issues. The Board of Management will now review the implications of these consultations, our Draft Digital Learning and Well Being frameworks and their recommendations which are outlined in a related **blog**.
